

Constant acceptance breeds complacency and mediocrity, rejection breeds determination and ultimate success. Don't hold grudges against the Judges. Determine to paint something better to submit next year. So, if at first you don't succeed, then you can count yourself as pretty normal! Rejection helps to keep us humble." "It is not the subject that makes a painting work, It is the interpretation of the subject by the artist that lifts it out of the ordinary. "(Robert Wade)


2. AGM and Painting Delivery February 26th

Bob had planned to hold an exhibition of work during our exhibition in May but this has been brought forward and you can visit VAS Cato Gallery to see his work.


Dates: 21st February - 5th March

Deadline 22 March for the April - June Edition We all love receiving the magazine.



Unseen for 30 years - 80 + superb watercolours



A collection of over 80 superb paintings, unseen for 30 years has been "discovered" in Paul Crompton's studio.

Art connoisseurs who have viewed the paintings are amazed at the quality, detail and use of light.

His artworks are an eclectic mix of places, scenes, people and events. Also included is a complete collection of paintings of Ansett aircraft and helicopters flown in their first 60 years of operation - some 40 paintings. A unique and original collection.

Paul's art background is impeccable. His studies in Fine Arts, Architecture Design and Drafting, enabled him to pursue a uniquely creative and 'hands on' career, further recognised with Membership of the Royal Watercolour Society (the UK's prestigious "Old Watercolour Society," among whose alumni is JMW Turner). In Australia, he also held four Watercolour Society Memberships.

Paul's artwork is represented worldwide with over 650 pieces sold and housed in public and private collections. What an incredible achievement!

Inexplicably, Paul finally stopped painting 15 years ago. Now, his unseen artworks have been rediscovered!







Paul has been a Bayside resident for over 50 years and is a quiet achiever who has made a signicant contribution to our community. For example, he designed and made "surprise boxes" for dementia patients. He has made honour boards for Black Rock House and videos for Beaumaris Probus. He has been active with Blaze Aid helping repair fences for fire victims. For the RSL he donated paintings of Vietnam war action which were displayed at the Shrine. He is a Committee Member of Beaumaris Men's Shed. There is much more but no space here!

Paul's artwork will be sold at his "Retrospective" to be held at Brighton Town Hall between 15th - 17th March 2024. Paul wishes to donate some of the proceeds to charity.

The Watercolour Society of Victoria (WSV) is seeking applications from *emerging watercolour artists*.


This program supports and mentors emerging artists.
